Without the help of our local fleet and their captains in these situations, we might have lost more of our loved ones.

We have witnessed road systems throughout Alaska and other states that are constructed for tourists, hunters, and such...why are we (King Cove Residents) scrutinized as ones who would have such a detrimental impact on such a small part of the National Wildlife Refuge when all we are asking is for a 14 foot wide access road through such a small portion of the refuge?
