

**Summary of the Proposed Land Exchange  
in the**

“The Izembek and Alaska Peninsula Refuge and Wilderness Enhancement and  
King Cove Safe Access Act”

**Note: Implementation of this proposal will require approval by Congress and the Alaska Legislature.**

State of Alaska Lands conveyed to USA:

1. Map Ref. ID #1 – T 53S R85W-SM – **22,498 Acres** – wilderness status
2. Map Ref. ID #2 – T 54S R85W-SM – **20,595 Acres** – wilderness status
3. State agrees to designation of Kinzarof Lagoon submerged lands as State Refuge, subject to approval by State Legislature, which State believes is attainable.
4. Map ref. ID #4 – Portion of land from Kinzarof Lagoon, “bookends” to north of Hovercraft Site, becomes wilderness by ANILCA **approximately 2,500 acres.**
5. Map Ref. ID#3 – Portion of land surrounding Mortensen Lagoon, north to Cold Bay, but not including any road section from Cold Bay to Lagoon **approximately 10,800 acres.**
6. Map Ref. ID #5 – King Cove relinquishes selections **approximately 5,430 acres.**

**Total conveyed to USFWS – 42,993 – Wilderness designated by Congress**  
**2,500 – Wilderness by operation of ANILCA**  
**45,493 – New Wilderness**  
**16,230 – Additional non-Wilderness Refuge**  
**61,723 – Total New Refuge Lands**

USFWS land conveyed to State of Alaska:

1. Map Ref. ID A-100’ to 150’ wide Easement **approximately 206 acres.**
2. Approximately **1,600 acres** of Refuge lands on Sitkinak Island (south of Kodiak Island)

Other Provision in Bill:

3. Prior restrictions on road corridor lands to restrict off-road access as defined in King Cove Access Project EIS; this bill further provides for a cable barrier on each side of the road within the wilderness, along with a prohibition of no off- road vehicles off of the road.
